Volunteer Spotlight—Janet Lyles

As a charter and founding member, I was a volunteer from the beginning of CQC. It was a wonderful way to meet people and being involved led to many events I'd never have gotten to without CQC. Working on the Quilt Colorado Board was really fun and being a part of those big groups of quilters from nearly every state was so exciting. Working in the judging of quilts, setting up banquet rooms, assisting teachers, etc., a quilter's dream.

For a number of years I was a CQC judge and learned more at every judging event. My quilt group, the M&Ms, were my committee along with the others that volunteered. We made several raffle quilts for CQC and for Quilt Colorado. We would have a "manufacturing" at my home and spent the day in work, fun and piecing. When we still served coffee and goodies at every CQC meeting, my Hospitality Committee would make as many as 300 cups of coffee. Had to get there early to do that! Chairing Fall Retreat led to even more great times—headaches too, but quilters are wonderful to work with and get the job done.

I am basically a traditional quilter and love scraps. I still do hand quilting, but most of my work is machine produced. Dresden Plate is one of my favorite patterns. I still say "in all aspects of quilting, if it does not make a difference at 30 feet or in 30 years, it's OK".

I learned to quilt when myself and 5 others, took lessons from Marge Kerr (charter and founding member) at my house in 1972 (before CQC).



The CQC raffle quilt, "Winter Wonder" has been busy selling tickets. This past Friday it visited the Arapahoe County Quilters' Festival of Quilts XIV in Littleton. There were over 100 quilts in the exhibit, most of which were judged. Many of those quilts were high quality and won awards. We sold tickets outside the area where quilts were displayed and did quite well. In one day, we sold 203 tickets and made \$184.00. Thank you ACQ, for inviting us to attend your festival.

I would like to remind those of you who have yet to send in your tickets and money, that we are now at mid-year. There is still time, but I would hate to leave you out of the chance of winning our gorgeous quilt. Please contact me if you would like more tickets sent to you. If you plan to attend a meeting, I can collect your tickets and payment there. As of June12th, 9,015 tickets have been sent to CQC members, and of those, 4,512 tickets have been returned as paid. That is 50% of the membership so far.

We have additional plans for "Winter Wonder" to travel. On June 21 it will be visiting the Piecing Partners' guild in Colorado Springs. We have yet to determine more sites to show off our raffle quilt. If your guild would like us to visit, please contact me and we can make arrangements.

Preparing the forms and getting them ready for the newsletter and the website so you will be able to enter "right away", has been my total focus up until now. Now, my new focus is on "deadlines".

Whoa!! What deadline? What does that mean? What do you mean closing dates?

Your entry form must be postmarked by July 30. Here's a positive thought, the earlier you get your entry form sent to me, the earlier you can relax until September.

What happens in September? There is a-n-o-t-h-e-r deadline! Ahhhhhh! Yes, you will have to drop your quilt off between September 1-15.

Another important deadline for you to know is the actual dates of Quilt-a-Fair's 2nd Annual Quilt Show! Those dates are September 22–23 at the Boulder County Fairgrounds, 9595 Nelson Road, Longmont, Colorado.


Picking up your quilt at Quilt-a-Fair after the show? The deadline to do that is between 5:00–5:45p.

Did you give permission for someone else to pick up your quilt at the show? (Note: The permission portion on the entry form pickup date at Quilt-a-Fair is September 23rd, not the 24th).

Picking up your quilt at one of the quilt stores? The pick up dates are between September 25–30 during the store's normal business hours.

If you dropped your quilt off at a CQC member's house, you will not pick it up from them. You will have to pick it up from Ellen Palmer's house (that's me) in Englewood between September 25–30. Be sure to call ahead to schedule a pick up time. (Note: I plan to be out of state in October, do not make me hold your quilt hostage until I return.)

Please, please, pick up your quilt on schedule. Don't make me have to donate it to our great charity committee! (The last sentence is a joke! Do not call me about that!)
