Other members have come forward to assemble the blocks, quilt the sandwich, and bind to finish the quilts to be won and donated to the winner's favorite charity. Everyone who contributes to the finished quilt earns points and is eligible to win by random drawing from the list of points. Each block is worth one point; assembly, quilting and binding are each worth three points. Some members have taken the challenge of using donated fabrics (thank you eQuilter) or the odd groupings of blocks/kits that Judy and Heather have put together. We appreciate all of your creations!

This month, we have a new block for you to try. It is a Scrappy Four X. This is a wonderful way to use up some of those scraps creating strip sets. Full directions are here in the newsletter and will be on the website. If you want to make blocks but don't come to meetings to turn them in, blocks can be mailed to Heather at 726 Folklore Ave, Longmont, CO 80504. Be sure to include a copy of the submission form with your name, contact information, and recipient charity if you win with your blocks.

Lastly, Heather is trying to account for quilts in progress from previous years. Each quilt top is given a number which follows the quilt throughout the finishing process. Please check your UFO's. 

# Scrappy Four X

10" Finished. Use 1 1/2"-2" wide strips at least 12" long. Use harmonious colors in a variety of lights, mediums and darks.

- 1. Stitch the strips together lengthwise to make a strip set at least 12" square. See Example 1.
- 2. Press all seams in the same direction.
- 3. Cut the strip set into 8 triangular pieces: corner to corner, top to bottom, and side to side. Example 2.
- 4. Rearrange triangles into a pleasing set with the vertical and horizontal strips perpendicular to each other. Don't overthink it! See mExample 3.
- 5. Stitch each quarter (2 triangles) of the layout together. Do not try to match seams. It's ok just breathe!
- 6. Set the quarters back into a square and stitch together as you would a four-patch. Be careful to keep the quarters turned correctly perpendicular to each other.
- 7. Press the seams.
- 8. Trim block to 10 ½".

# **Volunteer Opportunities**



# Book Review – Love Your Creative Space... by Carol Cook

Many quilters and fiber artists struggle with maintaining an organized and inspiring workspace. It is difficult to be our creative best when overwhelmed by clutter or unable to locate tools or project materials. In her book Love Your Creative Space (2020, C & T Publishing), Lilo Bowman challenges us "Don't let the size of the room, budget or physical limitations keep you from having a space you love." Lilo created this book after authoring a weekly topic "Let's get organized" on The Quilt Show blog and has organized it into four major sections. In My Stuff, the maker is encouraged to adapting a quilter's workspace for plan and set a date to get started. The first step is to sort and purge the stash starting with soft stuff (fabric, scraps, thread, yarn, and batting) then addressing tools, adhesive materials, markers, and embellishments. Throughout this section, Lilo provides many storage options based on the space available, whether a large studio or a small space tucked into a shared room or even a small closet. Many ideas for repurposing items already on-hand are identified instead of purchasing budget-busting specialized furniture. It's acknowledged that organizing one's stuff takes time and the maker is encouraged to handle it in several shorter periods to avoid getting overwhelmed.

In My Space, quilters should assess their personal taste, budget, and the space available to develop a plan to create an organized and inspiring space. Ideas for containing clutter, personalizing your space, and using horizontal and vertical storage are provided. Wall and flooring options, lighting and magnification options and cleaning routines are discussed as well. Ideas for frequent movers to make relocating a workspace easier are offered Lilo provides a section on



reduced capabilities due to illness or aging.

The My System section shows examples of how to personalize the workspace and to create an inspiring design wall. Readers are encouraged to have a designated temporary space for UFOs and WIPs and create a catalog to keep track of these projects. Storage of magazines and books which can take significant space is addressed. Several options are presented for storage of quilt tops and completed quilts to reduce potential damage. Quilters are encouraged to display completed quilts and other meaningful works to keep their creativity flowing.

The fourth section, Studio Gallery, illustrates the quilting studio designs of six well-known designers, which range in size from a small corner of a living space to a large studio space in



a new construction. There are plenty of photos of these spaces which demonstrate many of the workspace options and considerations discussed earlier in the book. Quilters will be able to adopt these ideas in their own spaces, depending on their preferences and space available.

Love Your Creative Space is a comprehensive guide to improving a maker's workspace with many options provided depending on the budget, space available and the quilter's personal taste. There are hundreds of full-color photos and clearly explained considerations for different needs. The process may be time consuming, but quilters are encouraged to set aside time weekly or monthly to achieve an organized and inspiring workspace.

# Block of the Month... by Sandy Wheeler Folded Star

# Folded Star Block 7 - June


Dark Fabric:

Cut 2 squares 5 1/2"

Medium Dark Fabric:

Cut 1 square 4 1/2" Cut 4 squares 3 1/8"

Cut 2 squares, 5 1/2"



Medium Fabric:

Cut 4 squares 2 1/2" Cut 2 squares 3 1/8"

Light Fabric:

Cut 6 squares, 3 1/8" Cut 4 squares, 2 ½"



# Center Square:

On the back of each of the  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " medium squares, draw a diagonal line from corner to corner. This will be your sewing line. Place a corner square on opposite corners of the  $4\frac{1}{2}$ " medium dark square. Sew on the drawn line and trim it  $\frac{1}{4}$ " away from the sewn line. Repeat with a second  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square on the opposite corner and trim. Press the corners out. Repeat with the other two  $2\frac{1}{2}$ " square on the other two corners. Square up to  $4\frac{1}{2}$ "



Layer each 31/8" Medium Dark square with a 31/8" Light square right sides together and each 31/8" Medium square with a Light square, right sides together. Following the general directions, make half square triangle blocks with each\*. Square these blocks up to 21/2" before continuing with the next step.

Following the diagram, sew each Med Dark/Light square together with a Med/Light square and each 2½" light square together with a Med/Light square.

Assemble the corner square according to the shaded diagram.







# Side Squares:

Layer each Dark Fabric square, right sides together, with a Light Fabric square. Follow the general directions for quick quarter square triangles\*\*. Sew together in squares, matching long sides of the triangles.

Square all sections up to 4½" and assemble block using shaded diagram for placement.

\*To make quarter square triangles: On the back of the lighter of the fabrics, draw a line diagonally from corner to corner. Then another line diagonally from corner to corner making an X. These will be cutting lines. Then 1/4" on either side of one of the lines, draw 2 stitching lines.

With two squares, right sides together, sew on the two outside stitching lines. Then cut into 2 halves on the line between the two stitching lines. Then divide those two parts on the other line. Press out and you will have 4, 1/4 square triangles.



\*\*To make half square triangle blocks: On the back of the lighter of the fabrics, draw a line diagonally from corner to corner. Then 1/4" on either side of this cutting line, draw 2 stitching lines.

With two squares, right sides together, sew on the two outside stitching lines. Then cut into 2 halves on the line between the two stitching lines. Press out and you will have 2, half square triangle blocks.

# May General Meeting Minutes

Abbreviated Minutes for Colorado Quilting Council May Membership Meeting

May 20, 2023, 10:00 a.m. at Waterford Church and via Zoom

Cathi Gerlach, President, called the meeting to order at 10:00 a.m. with a welcome to members in person and on Zoom. Minutes for the April Membership meeting and the May Board meeting were read by Betty Andrews, Secretary, and approved by members. Penny Christensen, Treasurer, reported \$29,067 in checking accounts, \$3,105 in Shirley Sanden Memorial fund, \$96,852 in savings and CD accounts for a total of \$128,224. Dawn Pettinger, 1st VP Membership, reported total membership of 394, 33 members present on Zoom and 53 members present in person. Dawn will send reminders out for those due to renew their membership. New membership rosters have been printed and will be available at our next meeting. Pam Ballard, 2nd VP Programs, announced a change in our speaker due to a family emergency. Terri Sontra of Purple Moose Designs has graciously agreed to speak for us today. Lila Bowman will be our speaker next month via Zoom. Pam will see if David Sirota can give his workshop via Zoom.

Committee reports were given with urgent deadlines for Hall of Fame and Outreach Awards. Karen Truesdell, Nominations chair, asked members to consider volunteering for three board positions, 1st VP Membership, Secretary, and 2nd VP Elect Programs 2025. Karen needs nominations by the first of September. Dawn Mills reported on Quilt-a-Fair plans, new vendors, the membership quilt show (forms needed by August 1st), and the Kids Quilt Show. Postcards are ready for distribution and Vicky Connely will share her National Park Quilts for the special quilt show. Laural Hoppes reported on the kids quilt registration forms, partnership with Rocky Mountain Quilt Museum, resources available at local quilt shops, and examples of simple quilts to try. Sue Comeau reported 1,231 raffle tickets were sold in the last month for \$1,027, total sales to date is \$2,541. Rosie Boettger, Exhibits chair, reported on the upcoming DIA show and introduced the Denver International Airport exhibits coordinator, Alyssum Skjeie, to answer questions about the exhibit area. Dates for submissions will be sent out in eblasts and in the newsletter. The show will start October 1st, but other information needs to be submitted much earlier. The theme is planes, Denver, Colorado, or aviation.

Mary Peterson of Firehouse Quilts shared information about their mission as they celebrate their 25th anniversary of providing comfort for children in emergency situations.

Eleven members shared an array of quilts for Show and Tell.

Terri Sontra of Purple Moose Designs spoke on The History of Sewing Machines, a Tale of Intrigue and Espionage. Terri had many surprises as she traced the history and development of our favorite tool.

Names for door prizes were drawn for members on Zoom and in person.

Cathi Gerlach adjourned the meeting at 12:18 p.m.

# May Board Minutes

CQC Board Meeting Minutes May 9, 2023, via Zoom

Cathi Gerlach, President, called the meeting to order at 6:00 p.m. 24 board members were present. Betty Andrews, Secretary, asked for approval of submitted April minutes-, two corrections were requested. Judy Forkner made a motion to approve the minutes as corrected. The board approved unanimously. Penny Christensen, Treasurer, submitted financial reports as of the end of April: CQC has \$29,067 in our combined checking accounts, \$3,105 in the Shirley Sanden Fund and \$96,052 in our savings and CD accounts. That is a total of \$128,224 in all CQC accounts. Dawn Pettinger, Membership, reported registrations received have been processed. Membership numbers are: 314 individuals, 64 businesses, and 16 guilds – total membership 394. First and second reminder e-mails have been sent to members with membership renewals due. Dawn is sending invitations to guilds that are not recent members with new membership forms outlining benefits. Changes to the proof copy of printed roster sent to printer on Tuesday, May 2 and the roster should be available to members by the May meeting. Pam Ballard, Programs, reported on upcoming speaker David Sirota. Holly's Quilt Cabin has downsized their student workshop area but can still manage 12 up to 16 with machines. Catherine Redford was a huge success. We had 18 paid/sponsored students. Christine Hause's shop is wonderful, provided to us free, but she can only host non-machine classes for up to 20 students. Pam met with Judy and Denise to explain the program process. Explaining the spreadsheets she developed to keep track of all the activities required to support programs. Pam requested that if anyone has a job description of VP of Programs, she would appreciate a copy to make any corrections or additions prior to the end of year.

Cathi Gerlach asked members for input for the QuiltFolk Magazine information request. Suggestions included: the book, DVD, and patterns created by the guild, connections with quilters across the state, efforts to get young people involved in quilting through the Kids Quilt Show and activities (and researching quilt shops involved in kids activities), our extensive library, our Outreach and Hall of Fame awards, Documentation, Competition, Retreats and other events to encourage the community of quilting. Other suggestions were our Shirley Sanden Scholarships, Gifts and Grants, Project Warm Hearts, Quilt Trail documentation and other activities that reach out to non-members.

Cathi asked for a card to be sent to the family of Joyce Green and for a library book to be purchased as a memorial. Mary Rush has suggested water bottles be purchased for members present at the July birthday meeting. A motion to purchase 200 bottles with our logo was made by Martha Johnson, Pat MacMillan seconded the motion. The vote approved the motion unanimously.

Cathi needs volunteers to chair the Hospitality, Fall and Spring Retreats, and Gifts and Grants committees.

Committee reports were submitted to the board for review. Melissa reminded members of deadlines for communications. Rosie Boettger reported on important deadlines for the DIA exhibit, details will be in the newsletter. Fall Retreat registration will be in the June newsletter. Dawn Mills reported on progress for Quilt-a-Fair plans. Sue Comeau and Vicky Stricker reported on raffle quilt sale activities. The meeting was adjourned at 6:44 p.m. by Cathi Gerlach






