Part 5 of 5

This is it—the final clue! If you've been keeping up with the clues each month, you'll be done in no time.

Please read all instructions before beginning. Basic quilt making and rotary-cutting skills are assumed. All dimensions include $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowances, unless otherwise indicated. Accurate cutting and piecing are needed. It is recommended that the first unit in each step be sewn and measured. Adjust your seam allowance as needed to achieve the correct size.

Making Block Y

Sew 2 Four Patch Units (from Part 2) to a Color A Flying Geese Unit (from Part 3), as shown. Iron seam allowances toward the Flying Geese Unit. Make 26 units.

Sew 2 Color A Flying Geese Units (from Part 3) to a Spool Unit (from Part 4), as shown. Iron seam allowances toward the Flying Geese Units. Make 13 units.

Sew these units as shown to make Block Y. Iron seam allowances toward the Flying Geese. Make 13 Y Blocks.

Making Block Z

Sew 2 Color A HST Units (from Part 2) to a Color B Flying Geese Unit (from Part 4), as shown. Iron seam allowances toward the HST Units. Make 24 units.

Sew 2 Color B Flying Geese Units (from Part 3) to a Spool Unit (from Part 4), as shown. Note the orientation of the Spool Unit is different from Block Y. Iron seam allowances toward the Spool Unit. Make 12 units.

Sew these units as shown to make Block Z. Iron seam allowances toward the Spool Unit. Make 12-Z Blocks.

Assembling the Quilt Top

Using the Quilt Layout Diagram below as a guide, sew the Block Y and Block Z blocks together into rows. Please note the orientation of the Spool block changes between Block Y and Z. Iron seam allowances in different directions on

alternate rows so they will nest when the rows are sewn together.

Then, sew the rows together. Iron seam allowances toward rows 1, 3 and 5.

Adding Borders

Sew three Rectangle Units (from Part 4) with two $3\frac{1}{2}$ " \times 12 $\frac{1}{2}$ " Background rectangles to make a Border 1 unit. Iron seam allowances toward the Background rectangles. Make 4 Border 1 units.

Sew a Border 1 unit to each side of the quilt as shown in the Quilt Layout Diagram. Iron seam allowances toward Border 1.

Add a $3\frac{1}{2}$ " Background square to each end of the remaining Border 1 units. Iron the seam allowance away from the corner squares. Attach to the quilt top and bottom as shown in the Quilt Layout Diagram. Iron the seam allowance toward Border 1.


Sew two $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Background strips together making 4 long Border 2 strips.

Measure the length of the pieced quilt top through the center. Cut two of the long $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Border 2 strips to this length. Sew one to each side of the quilt top. Press seam allowance toward the Border 2 strip.

Measure the new width of the pieced quilt top through the center. Cut the remaining two $2\frac{1}{2}$ " Border 2 strips to this width. Sew the strips to the top and bottom of the quilt top. Press seam allowance toward the Border 2 strip.

CONGRATULATIONS! You have completed Spool Dance, the CQC 2017 Mystery Quilt. We hope you enjoyed this adventure.

Please bring your completed quilt to a CQC meeting for Show and Tell. We love to see all the variations in color and fabrics.


Kathy shared her beautiful work and the amazing quilts she completed with her students.

CRITERIA/ELIGIBILITY:

- A. All entries must be current members of the Colorado Quilting Council.
- B. Quilt may not have been included or displayed in any previous CQC quilt show.
- C. Quilts cannot be older than 3 years.
- D. Quilts must consist of three layers: top, batting, backing held together by quilting (tying) through all three layers.
- E. Quilts must have a 4-inch finished sleeve attached to the full width of the top edge of the quilt.
- F. Quilt must have your name, address and quilt name on the back of the quilt, prominently displayed on a label pinned to the right side of the sleeve. Cover your name and all identifying information with either painter's tape or a piece of fabric securely safety-pinned to the quilt.
- G. Kit quilts and block of the month quilts, which include fabric in the kit, may not be entered to be judged. However, they may be entered in the display-only category.
- H. Quilts must be clean, free of pet hair, smoke or odor. CQC reserves the right to disqualify any quilt that does not meet show criteria, has been misrepresented by the photo, requires special handling or cannot be folded for shipping.
- I. In the event of a large or small number of entries in a given category, we reserve the right to further subdivide or combine categories.

REGISTRATION AND ENTRY FEE:

- A. Complete entry form with original signature must be **postmarked by July 30, 2017**.
- B. Include a non-refundable entry fee of \$15 per quilt (and \$35 prepaid postage if you are having your quilt returned by mail).
- C. Two photos with the Entry Form. One photo must show the full quilt and the other a close-up showing details of quilting. Photos may be printed on photo paper, submitted on a CD using a JPEG format or email to arthurwidow@msn.com.
- D. Mark both photos clearly with your name and the quilt name. Photos will not be returned and become the property of CQC.
- E. Include a stamped, self-addressed, #10 Envelope.
- F. Limit 2 quilts per person. One quilt per category. One quilt per entry form. **May mail two entry forms in same envelope.**

QUILT DROP-OFF/SHIPPING ARRANGEMENTS

- A. Each quilt must be in a cloth bag with your name, address and phone number permanently marked on the bag. One quilt per bag. Quilts will not be accepted in plastic or paper bags.
- B. Safety-pin your entry number on (3X5 index card) cloth bag containing the quilt. One quilt per bag. No entry will be taken without this entry card number attached to the cloth bag.
- C. All accepted quilts must be in the hands of the designated pick-up points listed below no later than **September 15, 2017**.

What Makes Me Crazy???

By Ellen Palmer, Quilt-a-Fair Quilt Show, Chairman

What makes me crazy is when I hear someone say, "just", "not my best", "not real good", "I made a mistake here", "I can't compete against_____".

"We" have all done it, and hopefully "we" are trying to conquer this bad habit of self-effacing. When we look at our finished quilt, we know where we have made a mistake or see places we know we could have done better. Most of the time we see these things AFTER the quilt is finished, then we tend to point it out to our friends, or even during show and tell at our local guilds.

Below are comments I often hear and *my reaction* to what has been said.

1. "if I hear one negative comment from a non-quilter, I don't show her any more quilts".
Really?? What negative comment would a non-quilter make???
2. "I haven't posted any of my quilts yet ***because all of yours*** are so beautiful".
3.and....."My quilts ***do not compare*** to yours".
Don't compare yourself to someone else! You are not the other person, so your work is not comparable.
4. "***My late husband was a deer hunter so I made him a quilt to use at the deer lease, it was just machine embroidered. The quilt now hangs on my living room wall as a memorial.***"
What a great memorial to her husband. I'm sure her husband loved that quilt. I'm happy she finally appreciated it.
5. A lady sent a quilt to her best friend as a gift and told her, "This is not my best work".
Really? How does that make the receiver feel? Do they wonder who got the "best work"?

Here are my recommendations to all quilters:

- A. Don't point out mistakes in your quilt.
- B. Don't compare yourself to someone else! We all have our own individual talents.
- C. Don't make negative comments about other quilts. (Who is standing next to you)???
- D. Finish what you start and do not be ashamed if you gave it your best.
- E. When receiving a compliment on your quilt, smile and say "Thank You."

It makes me smile when I go to a quilt show and see my quilt hanging for all to see. I love to stand near and listen to the comments that others are making. When I say, "that is my quilt", the onlookers are happy to actually meet the person that made the quilt they are admiring! (And, no, there hasn't been any negative comments made!!)

It takes confidence to put your work in front of others. The feedback you get from the Judges and fellow quilters will help you learn "where and how" you can improve your techniques and gain new confidences!

Kid's Corner

Charming Bow Tie Quilts!

Here is a simple Bow Tie Tutorial to show you how to create your own 12" block!

STEP 1:

From bow tie fabric, cut two 6.5" squares and two 3" squares; from background fabric, cut two 6.5" squares.

STEP 2:

Use a ruler and pencil to draw a diagonal line from corner to corner on the wrong side of the small 3" bow tie squares.

STEP 3:

Place those 3" squares on the corner of a 6.5" background square, right sides together with the raw edges aligned as shown. The ends of the pencil line should touch both sides of the background square.

STEP 4:

Sew along pencil line, backstitching at beginning and end if desired. Use ruler and rotary cutter to cut off excess fabric, leaving a $\frac{1}{4}$ " seam allowance. Press seams in preferred direction.

STEP 5:

Now it is time to sew your block together! Arrange pieces as shown, and sew squares into rows. Press seams and sew rows together. One final press, and your 12" (12.5" unfinished) bow tie block is done!

Quilters note: Are you interested in making smaller bow tie blocks? Use these cutting dimensions to make 6" quilt blocks: From bow tie fabric cut two 3.5" squares and two 1.5" squares, from background fabric cut two 3.5" squares.


