
All the quilting she does through her long-arm company, *Fairy Ring Quilts*, based in Conifer, is custom work.

She enjoys designing her own quilts and helping other quilters and their families complete their projects.

Before Hannah quilted, she danced. As a graduate of the Denver School of the Arts, she had extensive training in ballet and modern dance. She earned her Bachelors Degree in Fine Arts in Modern Dance at the University of Utah. In Utah, she performed reproductions of the works of Hanya Holm with renowned dancers, and she danced with Repertory Dance Theatre for the Arts of Salt Lake City during the 2002 Winter Olympics.

She is an enrichment life coach for Summit Education Group and teaches dance at Peak Academy of Dance in Conifer.

Programs Year-End!

As the year comes to an end, it is time to review the 2018 Programs. I hope you left each meeting feeling inspired and wanting to try something new. Our speaker line-up covered almost all aspects of quilting. We started with Sue Patten, a longarmer from Canada and her whole-cloth quilts, In February, Marty Ornish showed us how she gives new life to tattered quilts, quilts that have been loved and worn out. Her garments are unique and fascinating. In class, she shared her techniques for putting vintage cloths together. In March, Karen Eckmeier shared some of her new techniques with curves and squiggles, while many enjoyed taking her small villages class. Judy Gula in April took us to Indonesia and the wonderful world of batik. In class, we learned how to create our own designs with stamps and paint. In May, Jenny Lyon taught us how to be fearless when free-motion quilting. I'm sorry to say I missed June and July where Dierdre McElroy took us to Tahiti with her hand applique, and Rickey Tims joined us as we celebrated turning 40. In August, we traveled to Hotchkiss where Amy Meissner shared her "Inheritance" work featuring vintage textiles that were hanging in a museum in Anchorage when she joined us. In October, we enjoyed the Tokyo Quilt Festival through the eyes of Tracey Brookshier. Her class featuring her party bags pattern was so much fun. We ended the year with Victoria Findlay Wolfe from New York. Her quilts are modern versions of wedding rings, herringbones, stars and other vintage patterns. Her class was an eye opener with partial seams, a technique I learned a long time ago and had forgotten about.

I'm happy to report that all but two classes were full or nearly full. If you like hearing national speakers, think about taking a class this next year. Speakers require the class to make the trip to Colorado worth their time. CQC offers these classes at an extremely reasonable rate, a great chance to learn from some experts in the field. Also please consider selling all your raffle tickets, the sales of these also support our programs.

Lastly, thank you for allowing me to serve as your VP of Programs for a second time. I really enjoyed the opportunity to select the speakers for the year and hope, if nothing else, that you were entertained and had fun every month. 

Shoo Fly Block

Block Directions

This is an $8\frac{1}{2}$ " square block. It is made from as many colorful fabrics that you may choose with the cream or tan color fabric.

Cutting directions: include 1/4" seam allowance

- 2 cream or tan squares $4\frac{1}{2}$ " × $4\frac{1}{2}$ "
- 2 bright colored squares $4\frac{1}{2}$ " \times $4\frac{1}{2}$ "
- 1 Cut squares in half diagonally to make 4 half square triangles. Unit A
- 2 Cut 1 bright colored square $2" \times 2"$. Unit B center
- 3 Cut 4 cream or tan rectangles $2" \times 4"$. Unit C

Block Assembly:

- Sew 1 cream or tan triangle and 1 colored triangle together to make a half-square triangle. Make sets of 4 matching triangle squares. The squares should measure 4" × 4".
- 2 Lay out 1 set of triangle squares one $(2" \times 2"$ Unit B) and 4 matching cream or tan rectangles $(2" \times 4"$ Unit C) as shown in the block above.
- 3 Join into rows, join rows to complete the block.

Block is 9" unfinished.

Annual Committee Report: Scarlet Galaxy of Stars

The pattern was designed and made by Jan Rold. The pattern had 4,303 different red and white pieces. Within the white background were 148 red stars made from 215 red fabrics. Helping Jan complete the quilt: Cindy McChesney, quilter; Kathy Emmel, label; and Sue Keck, binding and attaching the label. The quilt was appraised at \$5,500 by Cindy Brick of Castle Rock.

Our "Scarlet Galaxy of Stars" was shown at our regular 2018 Colorado Quilting Council monthly meetings in Cherry Hills, Boulder, Fort Collins, Colorado Springs, Golden, Pueblo, Parker and Aurora. It was due to be shown in Hotchkiss, but due to an accident, did not arrive there. It was also exhibited at the Denver Quilt, Craft and Sewing Festival (Rusty Barn) in Denver in March and at CQC's Quilt-A-Fair at the Boulder County Fairgrounds in Longmont in September.

At each of the venues above, we were able to set up the quilt for sales. Top total ticket sales for the year are as follows: Pat Reynolds 54, Jackie Anderson 42, Barbara Jones 42, Betty Elsworth 36 and Katie Melich 36. Our raffle quilt drawing was held on December 1, 2018 at the General CQC meeting in Aurora. It is quite fitting that this year's winner of our "Scarlet Galaxy of Stars" quilt is also the member who made the highest amount of sales, Pat Reynolds.
