

The Tifaifai is Dierdra's singular passion, its simplicity is unrivaled in the appliqué world. Students leave the class with enthusiasm and confidence. This free-form appliqué method requires no pins, ironing, spray starch, or major preparation. The secrets of laying out the appliqué piece (which is cut while folded like a paper snowflake) onto the base fabric is shared and practiced in class. Students experience and learn about grain lines, warps and wefts of fabric weave and then baste their design with Roxanne Glue-Baste-It which Dierdra invented expressly for this technique. You will also learn the five basic elements of needle-turn appliqué and Dierdra's tricks for easy precision.



40th Anniversary Reflections

Competition Committee and Denver Library Show

This month we celebrate the work of our Competition Committee. The committee began in 1984 with these purposes:

- To establish guidelines for entering competition and/or judging quilts.
- To assist would-be judges and quilters in the mechanics of competition.
- To suggest categories for competition.

We wrote our first handbook for Competition and the note inside said:

“This handbook is designed to make competition a meaningful and enjoyable experience”

We have revised this booklet three times adding to it the latest information on judging and entering quilts to be judged in competitions. We have been at the forefront in enhancing the judging process in Colorado at shows, county and state fairs and have many National Quilt Association certified judges. We hold yearly trainings for scribes and judges so that we continue to share our knowledge throughout the state as quilts are entered in all levels of competitions.

We will learn more about this wonderful Committee at our June Meeting. If you have been involved in this committee, please join us and share a story about a competition event or a quilt that you saw that impacted you or the quilting experience.

The Denver Library Show was an extension of the Capital Quilt Show. We want to thank Shelly Young, Ellen Nepustil, and Pamela Walsh for their dedication to this project and showing CQC quilts in a variety of venues. We also appreciate our partnership with the Denver Public Library and their staff who love quilts and see them as an enhancement to the Gates Reading Room on the 5th Floor of the library. We hope that you will travel downtown this summer to see the show with the theme of “What The West Means to Me” and see who won the Best of Show prize this year. The quilts were judged by Daisy Boulter who is CQC Competition Committee judge providing feedback to the participants. The show will be up until July 1 and the library is open daily.

DUES CHANGES EFFECTIVE JULY 2018 DRAFT

As most of you know, the Board has been challenged with budget issues for several years. The largest costs for CQC are programs and the newsletter. We all agree that programs are a favorite feature of CQC. Having access to nationally recognized speakers on a variety of quilt topics is invaluable. The newsletter costs more than the current \$25 in annual dues to print and mail 11 issues a year. We could save most of that cost by using electronic transmissions, but that just doesn't work for many members. We've heard emotional pleas from members to keep the newsletter the same. We could raise dues for everyone, but we would lose some of our long-term members on fixed incomes.

So...the Board has developed a variable dues structure with many levels that we hope will meet more needs along with a membership year based on the member's anniversary date—a year from the date of initial membership. You'll always get a full year of benefits for your dues. Basically, if you prefer a mailed newsletter you'll pay \$10 more per year. If you access the newsletter on the website, your dues only go up if you want to contribute more to support the Council. To see the details of the dues options, check the back of the membership form enclosed in this newsletter. To make the bookkeeping changes, the front of the form has changed as well.

The new dues structure will take effect July 1, 2018 for new and renewing members after that date. For members who already paid 2018 dues, the new dues will take effect on your membership anniversary date—January 1, 2019 for most.

We hope that many of you will consider what CQC means to you and use the new membership levels to support CQC's work to preserve the heritage of quilting and be an inspiration and support to the quilting arts in Colorado.

May 19, 2018

American Mountaineering Center, Golden

President, Dawn Mills called the meeting to order at 10:00a. She thanked the American Mountaineering Center for their help and allowing us to use their space for our meeting. Dawn thanked Columbine Quilt Guild for providing refreshments.

The minutes from the Colorado Springs General Meeting were approved as published in the newsletter.

Karen Brown read the Abridged Minutes from the May 8th Board Meeting.

Officer Reports:

Dawn Mills, President: be sure to sign a signature block for the quilt that is being made for the CQC collection. Don't forget to like us on Facebook. Purchase the CQC book on Amazon and help us get royalties. When buying on Amazon be sure to type in CQC and donate to us. We need someone to step forward to be the Hospitality Chairperson and the Photographer. There are still several guilds and shops who have not received the postcards and flyers see Laural Hoppes and become a liaison for your guild or shop. The next planning meeting for the 40th anniversary and QAF will be in Arvada on Saturday, June 2nd.

Treasurer, Mary Rush—see the newsletter for details.

Membership, Pat Cleaveland—90 members present today, 5 guests present, 515 total members so far this year, 1 renewal today, and 3 new members today.

Programs 2018, Ellen Nepustil—see the newsletter for the schedule for the rest of 2018 and the signup forms for the workshops.

Committee Reports:

Project Warm Hearts, Nancy Samuel and JaNelle Erickson—no charity quilt given at the meeting. We have three kits for assembling blocks to give out, one quilt for binding, and one quilt for quilting.



Pinwheel Block

To celebrate 40 years of friendship with CQC, we have chosen the Pinwheel Block as our second Warm Hearts quilt block. To continue the Ruby Jubilee theme, we have chosen red and white (use of scraps is fine). Thank you so much for your participation.

Block Directions

This is a 8½" square block. It is made from whites and reds that you choose. We will make half-square triangles.

- Cut two white squares 5" and two red 5"
- From one white square draw a diagonal line from one corner to the other corner. Draw a line ¼" on each side of the center line.
- Place the white square atop the red square. Stitch along marked sewing lines.
- Cut between rows of stitching to make two triangle squares. Repeat these directions for the other white square. Now you have four triangle squares.
- Press seam allowances toward the darker fabric.
- Follow the photo to layout your triangles and sew together.
- Block should measure 9" square
- Fill out your form with your name and charity of choice for the drawing.




Batting Terminology

Bearding This is separation of batting fibers which then work their way to the surface between fabric weave.

Bonded This is when batting has been treated with resins, glues, or heat to fuse the fibers together. Heat bonding is also referred to as “thermal” bonding. Bonding is used to prevent bearding, clumping, and matting.

Drape Refers to the pliability of the finished project. If the finished project is soft, flexible, and forms to your body, then it has a lot of drape.

Fusible This is batting, stabilizer, or interfacing that has been coated on the back with either a dried glue or resin that will change to an adhesive when heated with an iron. Fusible batting and interfacing are good choices when pinning may be an issue.

Loft The thickness of batting is called “loft”. It also can refer to the breathability or “airiness” of the fiber structure. A “low loft” batting is thin and flat, while a “high loft” batting is thicker, fluffy, and poofy. A good rule of thumb when deciding between low or high loft: low loft shows off your pieced pattern whereas high loft shows off your quilting stitches.

Needle-punched A process where a machine uses thousands of tiny needles to fuse, or felt, the batting fibers together. Needle-punching causes the batting to be stronger and denser with lower loft. It can also cause the batting to be stiffer. Needle-punched batting is not good for hand quilting.

Scrim Treatment where a thin layer of woven fibers is applied to either one or both sides of the batting. It is similar to stabilizer. It keeps the batting fibers from shifting, separating, and clumping while quilting. Scrim is usually polyester, nylon, or other manmade material. Scrim adds strength to the batting. It also prevents stretching.




