Dear Quilting Friends,

Design...We had a really fun day in Ft. Morgan with our speaker Jill Finley. Her designs both in quilts, patterns, techniques and notions were amazing. She puts a whole new spin on precision. She is a delightful lady that I got to know

on our drive to Ft. Morgan after I picked her up at the airport. If you ever get the chance to volunteer to host one of our lovely speakers, take the chance. I always have a great time, learn something new, and get a different perspective on quilters' lives.

You will notice the budget in this edition. You will see that it is not a balanced budget. And you know I am a proponent of a balanced budget when I believe we have the funds to cover everything we do in a year as CQC. This year we tried to move things around and cut as many corners as possible, but it just wasn't possible to come up with an extra \$5,000. So, we are in debt unless we use our reserve CD, which we don't want to do. We need to find ways to make more money. We have opportunities to do that. Quilt-a-Fair being one of them. We can all bring friends with us to meetings and that will increase the revenue at the door. We will have local guilds share space, so two guilds in the space of one booth, pipe and drape between them of course. This will allow us to sell additional vendor spaces. We need to increase our sales of Raffle Tickets. We have an amazingly beautiful quilt, that by itself should sell tickets; however, when only 56% of our members, sell or buy the tickets, we are left with 6,000 tickets. My math skills aren't great but if we were to sell the majority of those tickets at the \$1.00 price, we can make up the deficit. We have been using our reserves; with fewer members in the last couple of years and losing the year of Quilt-a-Fair revenue when we had the 100 Flood, it has caught up with us. We will explore a reduction of newsletters and pages overall, which is

CQC's 2017 Mystery Quilt

And now, get your rotary cutters and sewing machines started!

Part 2 of 5

Part 1 of this mystery quilt series was revealed in the February issue and included the materials list and cutting instructions for the entire quilt.

Please read all instructions before beginning. Basic quilt making and rotary-cutting skills are assumed. All dimensions include a 1/4" seam allowance, unless otherwise indicated. Accurate cutting and piecing are needed. It is recommended that the first unit in each step be sewn and measured. Adjust your seam allowance as needed to achieve the correct size.

Making Four-Patch Units

With right sides together, sew a Color D 2" strip and a Background 2" strip together as shown below to make Band A. The band should be 31/2" wide. Make 6 Band A sets.

Iron the seams towards Color D strip.


Cut the bands at 2" increments as shown below to make 104 two-patch units.


Sew 2 of the two-patch units together to make a Four Patch unit. Make 52 Four Patch units.

Remove the few stitches between the seam and the edge of the Four Patch unit as shown below.

Turn Four Patch unit to wrongside up and spread the center to fan out as shown. This will look like a mini-Four Patch where the seams meet in the center. Iron Four Patch Units.










Making Half-Square Triangles (HST)


Mark all of the Background $3\frac{7}{8}$ " squares diagonally from corner to corner on the wrong side of the fabric.

Match each of the 25 Color C 3½" squares with a Background 3½" square. With right sides together, sew a scant 1½" on each side of the marked diagonal line as shown. Cut on the marked diagonal line to create 50 HSTs.



Iron the seam towards the Color C fabric.






Repeat the instructions above using 36 Color A 3½" squares and Background squares; Making 72 HST units.

Step 2 is complete. There should be:

- 52—3½" Four Patch units made with Color D & Background
- 72 $3\frac{1}{2}$ " HSTs made with Color A and Background.
- 50—3½" HSTs made with Color C and Backgound.

Stand back and admire your work!

"Explore Quilting With CQC" May Meeting

Kathy Emmel Presentation

Kathy will give a 30 minute presentation on *Quilting* with Kids—Techniques and Tips. It will be a trunk show of quilts made by her first through sixth grade students.

Kathy majored in art/graphic design and earned a K–6 Classroom and Art Specialist Teaching license. She taught in public school for almost 30 years and during 17 of those years, she made large group quilts with her students. During the past six years of retirement from teaching, she has continued to work with her granddaughter's classes making group quilts. Over 1,000 kids have created quilts with Kathy.

She has also made numerous quilts since the 1970's and loves working with fabric and design. Her quilts have been published in numerous books and magazines and exhibited in one-woman shows at the Rocky Mountain Quilt Museum and the Museum of the American Quilters Society, as well as the International Quilt Festival, the Vermont Quilt Festival, the American Quilters' Society Show, Quilt Expo in Barcelona Spain, the Road to California Show, the Husqvarna Viking National Convention, the Kokusai Art Traveling Exhibit (Tokyo, Japan) and at local venues throughout Colorado. She will have copies of her book, Kids Quilt Together: The ABCs of Group *Quilts*, published by C&T, available for \$20. The book contains vast information on making group quilts with any age participant, and there are various techniques that can be used on fabric. Also included are fun projects parents and grandparents can do with their families. Please join us in May to welcome and hear Kathy's lecture.

Scrappy Strips on a Square

Block Directions

This is a 10" square block. It is made from as many colorful fabrics that you choose. The middle section should be a black material.

- One 2½" black strip
- Scrap strips of bright colors cut from 1" to 2" wide
- This block is constructed as a foundation-pieced square
- 1 Cut a 10"x10" square from freezer paper.
- 2 Lay the black strip, right side up, centered diagonally across the shiny side. Make sure it hangs out at least 1/4"-1/2" beyond the points. Press.
- 3 Lay a bright strip wrong side up on top of the black strip matching raw edges on one side.
- 4 Using a small stitch, sew the two strips together with a 1/4" seam. Open out and press. The freezer paper will hold the strip down allowing you to place the next strip without using pins.
- 5 Lay another strip right side down on top of the previous string. Again, make sure it hangs out at least ¼"— ½" beyond the paper. Stitch and flip.
- 6 Continue adding strips with the sewing and flipping technique (turning the block and repeating on the opposite side) until the paper is completely covered and fabric is extending on all sides 1/4"—1/2".
- 7 Turn block wrong side up and trim to a neat ¹/₄" seam allowance around the paper. Remove the paper when complete.
- 8 Block is $10\frac{1}{2}$ " unfinished.

Juried, Judged, Open, Closed—What Is The Difference?

Ever feel like you've just gotten off a plane in another country and don't speak the language? I would like to de-mystify a few of the words we use to describe the different types of quilt shows.

Juried: This is a show that you have to send in two photos of your quilt along with your entry form and fee. The photos are then previewed and the quilts that are accepted in the show are chosen from these photos. You will receive a letter telling you that your quilt was accepted. The selected quilts are then collected, judged and hung in the show.

Regarding the photographs: the first photograph needs to be of the entire quilt. The second photograph is a close up/detail of the quilting, techniques used, etc. It is very important that you take good photographs to send in. A photo of your quilt thrown across a rocking chair (because it is cute) or the barbecue in the background will not make it into the show.

Judged: This is a show that anyone who enters will have their quilt hung. At most quilt shows, when you send in your entry form, you can indicate if you don't want your quilt judged. (Again, I ask why would you do that? See the article in February's Colorado Threads).

Non-Judged: This is pretty self-explanatory. Some quilt guilds have quilt shows and do not have the quilts judged, they only display the quilts. There are a number of reasons this is done and it depends on the individual guild. A non-judged show may or may not be juried,

depending on a variety of things, for example: room is unavailable for the number of quilts entered.

Open: This is a quilt show that anyone can go and observe the judging while it is taking place. The most common places that have open judging are the county and state fairs. Not all quilt guilds have open judging because there isn't enough room for extra people that are not directly involved in the judging process.

I would like to encourage everyone to go to an open judging to see and hear what judges say. You will hear more spoken comments than those written on the evaluation form. There is always something to be learned by hearing what is being said about any quilt, not only your own. You do not have to have a quilt entered in an open show to be able to observe.

Closed: A closed quilt show indicates that only the people that are helping with the quilts are allowed in the area. An audience is not allowed to observe. It does not matter if you have entered a quilt or not. There are a few county fairs that have closed judging but not many.

The Quilt-a-Fair Quilt Show will be judged. I will let everyone know if it will be open or closed when we get closer to September and all arrangements have been finalized. I have seen some of the great quilts made by CQC members at show and tell and I am anticipating seeing a lot of these lovely quilts entered in our show this year!

Quilts should be photographed against a neutral background; white, black or grey. All edges of the quilt must be visible in the full picture, including a small portion of the neutral background.

Email your two images, one quilt at a time, with a short statement about your quilt, as well as width and length of quilt to:



Kid's Corner

A Few Tips on Choosing Fabric

For most quilting projects use 100% cotton. Try not to mix fabrics as 100% cottons and blends will wash and wear differently. That said, if you are making something like a memory quilt out of old clothes or something similar where you are mixing a variety of fabric types, it will probably be fine.

I do not prewash my fabric I like the sizing that is in the store-bought fabric because it makes it easier to accurately rotary cut. If you stick with high-quality 100% cotton quilting fabrics you should not have a problem with colors bleeding. If the fabric is older or lower-quality, I would suggest prewashing before you start cutting.

One of the most intimidating parts of beginning a quilting project is choosing the right fabric. Here are a few simple tips to help that process:

There are two main factors to consider when picking fabrics for a project: color and scale.

Color: First pick a balanced variety of colors—especially lights versus darks. Then pick different shades of the same color. This will give your quilt visual interest. Fabric colors that are too matchymatchy (i.e., all the oranges are the same shade) will make your quilt feel flat.

Scale or size: Large-scale graphic prints available are fun to work with and make really interesting quilts. But, if every print you use is the same scale, your quilt will look out of control. There is no place for your eye to rest and the beautiful prints will get lost. What you need is contrast. Not only in color, but in scale.

Divide fabrics into groups by scale: large, medium, and small. The large and medium prints are busy and colorful but the design repeats are closer together in the medium scale prints. The small prints almost read as solids. These prints provide a contrast for the busier prints to really show them off. You can use solids, but the design becomes flat.

With the myriad of fabric designs to choose from, it can be overwhelming to narrow your options. Pick a

focus fabric first, then build your quilt around it.

When you've assembled your fabrics, and before you start cutting, stand back and look at the collection as a whole. Squint your eyes to change perspective. Is something too dominant? Something lacking? Now's the time to change.

If you are still experiencing some analysis-paralysis, there are some excellent products on the market that make great shortcuts. First of all, designer fabrics come in collections with coordinated colors and a variety of print scales. Stick with a collection and it simplifies your decision.

Even better, fabric companies like Moda now feature pre-cut, coordinated fabrics in squares and strips. One product called Charm Packs contain about 40 different 5" squares (at least one print from an entire collection). They also come in a pack of 10" squares. Beginning quilters, this is a simple way to get a large variety and easily coordinated fabric, without having to buy a lot.

Choosing a color scheme:

This is one of my favorite parts of creating a quilt. I love playing with color, which is probably why I'm always making something new.

I keep my colors the same vibrancy, such as warm (red and orange) or cool colors (blue and green).

Don't be afraid to ask for opinions/help. Quilt shops will have helpful staff who can help you in your selection. Ask for opinions from local quilt guilds or trusted friends. Having someone who can look at your choices and give feedback is helpful. You can try out different combinations and edit together.

When asking for help, give them a place to start. Walk around a shop and pick out two or three bolts that "speak to you". This will give them a sense of your preferences.

Final thoughts on choosing fabric in general: Don't let it stress you out. Yes, it takes practice, but just go for it. The more you try, the more you will like what you do. Have faith in yourself.

SUPPLIES AND TOOLS:

1/4 yd Fabric or 1 Fat Quarter for Tote

1/4 yd Fabric or 1 Fat Quarter for Lining

3/8 yd Fabric or 1 Fat Quarter for Pocket

1/4 yd Interfacing (optional)

Disappearing Fabric Marker

Matching Thread

Iron and ironing surface

Basic Sewing Supplies

Finished size: 8" tall and 6" in diameter.

front every 1"-4" as desired.

Optional: pin or baste interfacing to wrong side of tote and bottom circle.

Pin or baste pocket to bottom edge of tote.

Stitch pocket to tote along all lines.

Sew a basting line $\frac{1}{4}$ " along bottom edge; clip every $\frac{1}{4}$ " up to stitch line.

With RST, stitch side seam.

Divide and mark tote top and bottom and the bottom circle into fourths.

With RST, match marks and stitch bottom circle to tote bottom; clip curves.

Fold handle in half lengthwise; press; open and fold edges to center; press.

DIRECTIONS:

Use 1/4" seam allowance

Cut one 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " × 20" for tote and one 4" × 10" for handle.

Cut one 8 $\frac{1}{2}$ " × 20" for lining and one 6 $\frac{1}{2}$ " circle for bottom.

Cut one $10\frac{1}{2}$ " × 20" for pocket and one $6\frac{1}{2}$ " circle for bottom.

Optional: cut one $8\frac{1}{2}$ " × 20" interfacing and one $6\frac{1}{2}$ " circle for bottom.

With right sides together, fold pocket in half lengthwise, press.



Edge stitch both sides of handle.

Pin or baste handle to top sides over mark.

Stitch lining side together, leaving an opening for turning.

Divide and mark lining as above.

Match bottom marks to circle and sew.

With RST, stitch lining top to tote top.

Turn RS out through opening; press.

Edge stitch top edge.

Slip stitch opening closed.

Use marker to draw stitching lines onto pocket

Gifts & Grants Report

Gifts & Grants has two requests for grants for this year.

The first is from Lara Beckwith of the Hoffman Public Library, part of the Aurora Public Library system. They are requesting a grant of \$4,000 to cover the cost of purchasing four sewing machines and maintaining them for four years. They plan on purchasing Bernina machines from eBay in order to have durable machines that they can afford for the sewing students. They will use the machines to start a sewing class program at the library and also plan to make it a mobile class in the future, at other libraries in the system. They plan to spend \$2,000 for the machines and the remaining \$2,000 for maintenance. They currently have \$900 to get the program started.

Gifts and Grants asked the Board to recommend to the membership to provide the Hoffman Library a grant for \$2,000 at this time to purchase the machines as the full amount they are requesting exceeds our annual Gifts & Grants budget. By providing the initial amount, it will allow them to get the program started and they can apply to other entities for grants to cover the maintenance expenses.

The recommendation was passed by the Board and will be presented to the membership.

The second request is from Dianne Myers of Firehouse Quilts. This is a group that makes charity quilts for firemen to give to fire victims. They also provide quilts to other organizations that provide services to those in need. They are requesting a grant of \$500 to help cover operating expenses including storage, insurance and basic expenses. Previously, they covered these with their annual quilt show but have stopped doing that show and need to find other means of covering their expenses. They receive grants from at least three other entities and donations of fabric and thread from their members.

Gifts & Grants asked the Board to recommend to the membership to provide a grant to Firehouse Quilts for \$500 to help them cover their operating costs for 2017.

The recommendation was passed by the Board and will be presented to the membership.
