



CQC's current membership roster includes 357 individual members, 71 business members, and 15 guilds and show members, for a grand total of 443 members. For CQC members who joined before 2019, your membership renewal date is January 1, 2024. That means that dues are to be paid by that date. E-mail reminder notices and the membership form were sent out in December to members with January renewal dates. Book Review - Quilting with Kids ... by Carol Cook

Wendy Sheppard's daughter Gwendolyn started showing interest in her sewing and quilting activities at a very young age. Wendy, a quilter, designer, and instructor, saw this as an opportunity to share her passion and create a stronger connection with Gwendolyn. Thus began a shared journey which has lasted for several years. Wendy and Gwendolyn decided to create "Quilting with Kids" (2020, Landauer Publishing) so other adults and children could experience the same joy of sharing a creative outlet together.

This book contains a surprising amount of information to help adults teach children the sewing and quilting skills needed to successfully create lovely projects. As expected, there are introductory sections on gathering tools and supplies needed and keeping safety first. Additional information is included on why we should teach our children to sew and how to foster a fun and loving attitude toward learning. Wendy reminds parents that it can take time for children to gain all the skills needed and sometimes it may be better for the parent to finish the project to keep from overwhelming the child. And parents should always encourage their child to use their imagination and creativity to come up with their own designs.

The book's 24 projects are presented in sections and chapters arranged in sequential levels of difficulty, as a quilter would expect. However, within each type of project there are options. Quick start projects include napkins and pillowcases, but there are several types of each, such as basic, pieced, corner triangle and embroidered napkins, and basic, artsy, contrasting cuff, pieced cuff, and mini doll-sized Page 6 Colorado Threads January 2024



pillowcases. This allows kids to develop more skills and complete additional projects without being overwhelmed by too much information.

Skill-building projects include several patterns using squares, rectangles, framed blocks, and strips. These projects include placemats, ornaments, and pillows, in addition to quilts. Most quilt projects are crib size or smaller... even a doll quilt! B&W layout diagrams are provided so kids can design their own version and experiment with colors. The book concludes with more complex projects including log cabin, snowball, and bowtie quilts for young quilters to tackle as their skills develop. It's important to let the child set the pace to keep the process fun though challenging.

There are many full-color



pictures to help illustrate the techniques and projects. Also included are tips from Wendy and Gwendolyn for both the adults and kids. Tips on how to improve skills, how to use the finished projects and how to individualize the projects to make the process more fun. Teaching kids how to quilt can help them develop real-life skills that can be carried over to other aspects of their daily lives, such as persevering through problems and working with others.

Annual Membership Report for 2023

The CQC Library collection was increased by 195 items in 2023, mostly through a large donation from the Parker Piece Keepers Guild, other donations from generous CQC members and a few purchases. Library items published in 1985 and earlier were retired to make room for these newer items. There are now 2,653 items in the CQC Library collection. Duplicate and retired items were sold at Quilt-A-Fair to generate additional revenue of \$422. Library items were made available for check-out at in-person general meetings and via mail. Checked out books were returned at general meetings or via mail. Book reviews were provided for the monthly CQC Newsletters. It has been a pleasure to serve as the COC Librarian in 2023, and I'm looking forward to continuing in 2024.

Quilt Trails finished an inventory at the end of 2023. The next inventory is recommended to be conducted in 2028. In the interim, all members are encouraged to report new and missing blocks to the Quilt Trails Coordinator. The coordinator asks permission of the block owner before posting any referrals and often consults with the CQC documentarians to assist the owners in naming their blocks.

In 2023, several trail tables were updated on the internet. A new Royal Gorge trail was added to the Colorado Trails in the Canon City area.

People have asked about how to make blocks. CQC is not currently making blocks. The quilt store in Broomfield offered a class last spring at a 'maker space' located in their shopping strip called Planks and Paint. Shop owners have been encouraged to let the class know they can be included in our online trails list by contacting CQC and the Quilt Trails Coordinator. The membership was notified of this maker space, and people were referred during Ouilt-a-Fair. Five retired trail blocks were available as of September for purchase through the CQC Ways and Means committee.

No budget is currently required for this activity.

Competition Committee Annual Report 2023

All information on the CQC website has been kept up to date regarding dates/ locations and times for meetings, including Fair dates/addresses and general information about the Competition Committee. (Thank you Melissa!!)

Judging of County and State Fairs began on July 8, 2023 and ended on August 17, 2023.

I am thankful for the Competition Committee Members that we currently have. Their undertaking and commitment helped us get through what I like to call "The Judging Season". 2022 and 2023 Judging Seasons have been difficult due to the small number of Judges we currently have. This year we had:

22 Fairs covering Colorado County and State Fairs plus the Wyoming State Fair and one Wyoming County Fair. Because several of the fairs require more than one Judge/Scribe, there were a total of 32 Judge/Scribe positions required. the infor (approxi Budget: I request 2023 and I have

5 Judges, 10 Scribes. 1,306 quilts were judged (295 more quilts than in 2022), 18 Fairs were "open to the public" and 4 Fairs were "closed". Most of these closures were due to lack of space for anyone not helping with the quilts.

I have written (almost) monthly articles for the CQC Newsletter pertaining to Competition. I have given "talks" or arranged for another Judge to speak to local guilds, upon their request.

We are still in need of people interested in becoming Judges/Scribes.

The meeting dates of the Competition Committee and 2024 Fair schedule (including addresses) will be posted on the CQC website as soon as the information is available (approximately April 2024). Budget:

I requested \$920.00 for my budget for 2023 and am currently under budget. I have ordered enough Judges Choice and First Time Entry Ribbons for 2024. I still have a few Award of Excellence Ribbons available but may have to order more in 2024.







Please use 2 complementary colors (across from one another on the color wheel) and an off-white or cream background.

Background: off-white/cream Cut 4 - 6 ¾" x 2 ¼" rectangle C Cut 2 - 5" squares D Complementary color 1 Cut 2 - 5" squares A Complementary color 2 Cut 2 - 5" squares B



Cut all 5" squares diagonally in half to form triangles. A, B, D

Cut the background rectangles at 45 degrees to measure

6 ¾"x2 ¼"x4 ½"x 3 1/8"- C. Refer to diagram below.

Be sure to trim fabric right side up and at the correct angle.

Piece ¼ of the whole block, using a scant ¼ seam allowance:


Section 1: Stitch C (background) to A (Comp 1) along the right 5" side of A to form a triangle.

Section 2: Stitch D (background) to B (Comp 2) along the right side of B to form a triangle.

Section 3: Stitch the two triangles together along the 6" base.

Complete four Section 3's. Square each Section 3 to 6 ¼", making sure the diagonal seams come exactly to the corners.

Stitch the four Section 3's together as a four-patch, keeping the background fabric to the outside fabric to the edge of the whole block. 12" unfinished block


