Pat Pauly is a sought-after lecturer and teacher in contemporary fiber arts. Pat shares her wealth of knowledge from decades of working in design. Known for her improvisational technique, she uses bold color and unusual juxtapositions of printed and painted fabric. Her workshops on contemporary art quilts

Museum in 2004. The exhibition of 100 historical quilts soon refueled her work with contemporary textiles, and she has redefined her textile art. Pat served as the guest curator and exhibition designer for the State University of New York at Oswego College's exhibition in 2008 **A Personal Landscape**. Pat also curated **The Almighty Dollar: Contemporary Art Quilts** and **The Exquisite Corpse: Contemporary Art Quilts** in 2010, and **Parallax: Views of Contemporary Quilt Artists**. In 2015, Pat curated and designed the exhibition **Quilts 20/20: Traditional Roots / Contemporary Art** was shown in Harrisburg, Pennsylvania. She is a frequent consultant for designing and curating textile exhibitions.

Her art quilts have been featured in numerous publications and exhibitions. Her workshops focus on design and technique, as well as when to apply rules, and when to toss them out. Pat Pauly's studio is in Rochester, New York.

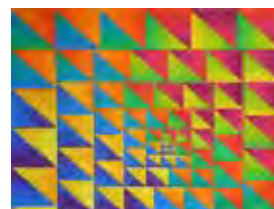

Retro Camper Pin Cushion

Supplies and Tools:

Camper pattern
9"×12" Felt in teal (2), white, black, and red
1 bag of Poly-Fil

Directions:

Using patterns cut 2 camper bases, 1 10"×3" rectangle, door, and tire cover out of teal felt.

Cut 2 camper contrast, 1 window, 1 tire center, and 1 7"×3" rectangle out of white felt.

Cut 2 awnings and 2 curtains out of red felt; and cut 2 tire pieces out of black felt.

Sew together tire center to tire base using a hand whip stitch. Sew on other half of tire, and fill with Poly-Fil before sewing closed.

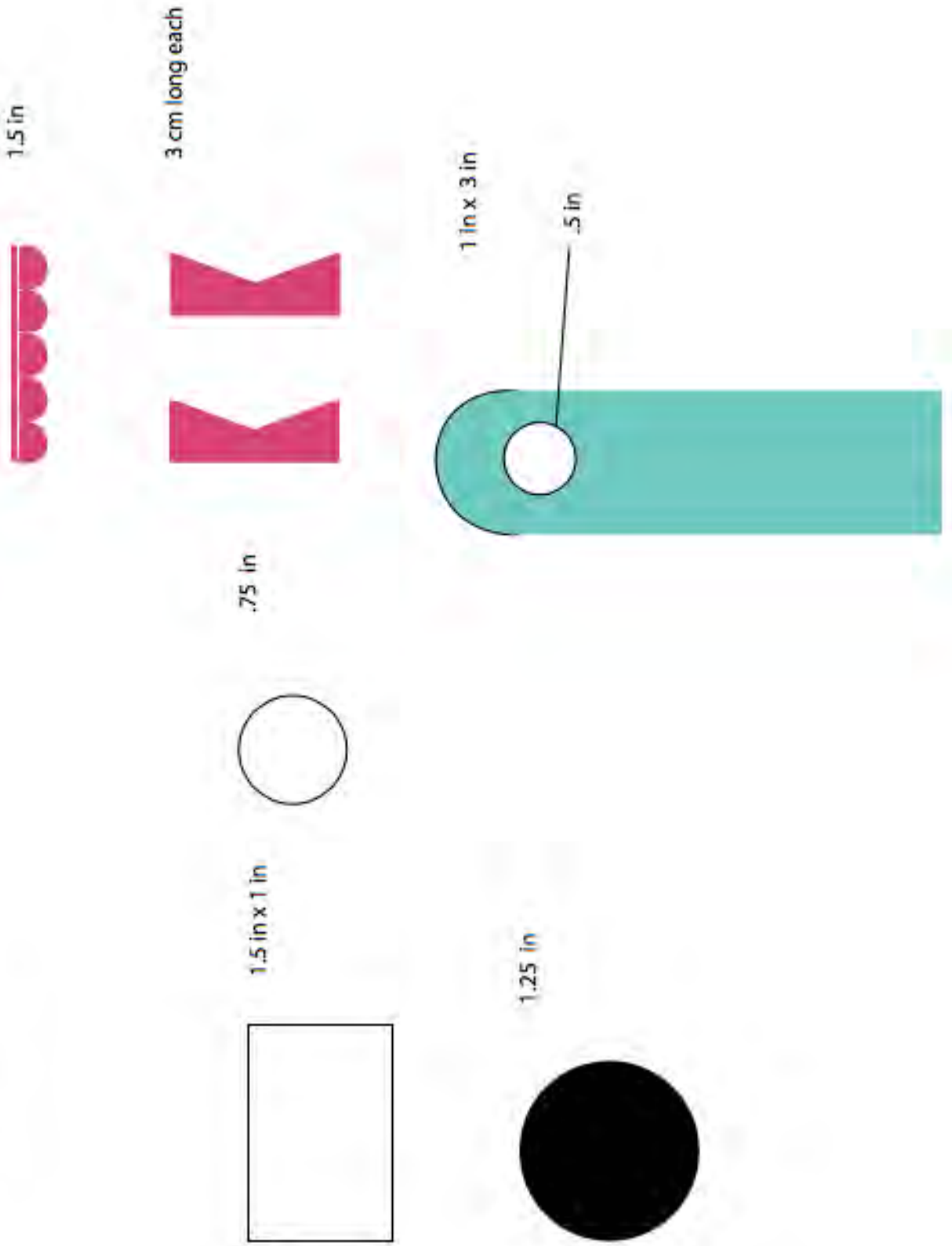
Sew camper detail onto both camper pieces. Sew door, window, tire, and other embellishments to one side of camper base, using photo as a guide.

Sew white rectangle to bottom of camper, attaching both sides of camper base together.

Repeat process with teal rectangle to top of camper. Fill camper with Poly-Fil before stitching closed.



Retro Camper Pin Cushion



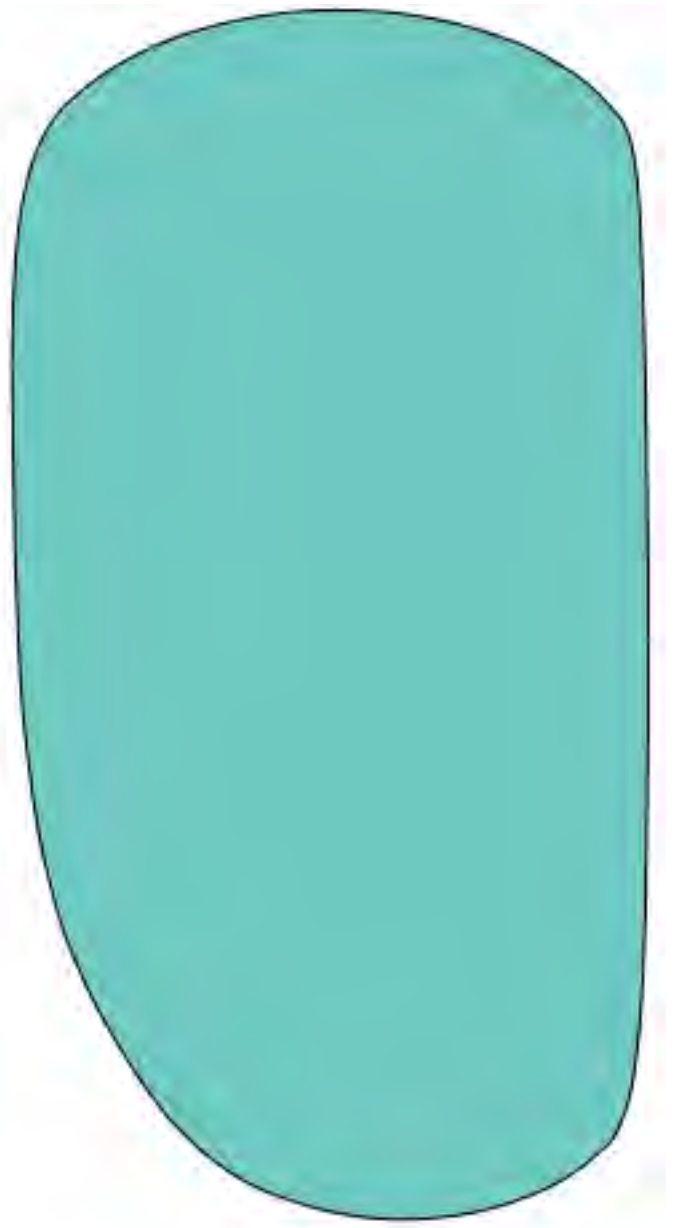

Firehouse Quilts of Colorado

Firehouse Quilts of Colorado was organized in early 2000 and became a non-profit organization in 2003. Their mission is to provide quilts for children in crisis by donating to 12 Colorado fire departments, an ambulance company, several hospitals, Victim's Advocate Offices, County Social and Human Service agencies, a women's shelter, a food bank, and the Douglas County Task Force.

During the past year, Firehouse donated nearly 1,000 quilts to these agencies. So far in 2017 they have made over 800 quilts and will hopefully meet their goal of 1,000. Over 50 active members give generously of their time to piece and quilt snuggle quilts, lap quilts, and some twin quilts.

Their fabric and batting is donated or paid for with grants and cash donations. It is with much gratitude that Firehouse Quilts thanks the people and organizations that allow them to continue the mission of helping children in crisis.

They meet twice a month at Shiloh House, 6400 West Coal Mine Avenue in Littleton.

Special Quilt Tips

Used carefully, it is possible to mark patterns on dark fabric with small pieces of regular hand soap.

Keep a careful touch on your quilt when machine quilting. Use light pressure and move it gently, letting the machine and your walking foot do the pulling. If you are too heavy-handed, the quilt will drag and cause the stitches to become uneven.

When appliquéing, use thread that matches the color of the patch and not the background fabric.

Maintain your machine. There's nothing more frustrating than a breakdown when you're in the middle of sewing. The quickest job is to keep the bobbin case clean from lint, a quick brush and you can continue.

If you want to show off special quilting threads, such as multi-colored or metallic, increase your stitch length slightly to leave more thread on the top of your quilt.

When you begin a machine-quilting session, warm up on a practice piece first, before you start on your quilt.

Draw quilting designs in the order you will stitch them, as this will help make your quilting smoother and more trouble-free.

Before you start cutting fabric for your blocks, look for pattern pieces that can be chain pieced or strip pieced together to save you time.

To have your quilted stitches more clearly visible on lighter coloured fabrics, pull the thread slightly more taut than usual.

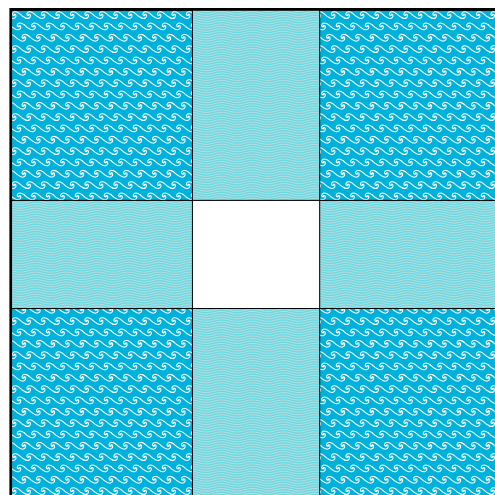

Nine Patch Variation

Block Directions

This is a 12" square block. It is made from blue or green fabrics that you choose and white with no novelty prints. The center should be a white (not cream) material.

- Cut 3½" square out of white for the center.
- The square should either use all greens or blues with both a light and dark fabric.
- Cut four matching 5" squares from a blue or green print.
- Cut four matching 3½" × 5" rectangles from a light blue or light green print.
- Lay out pieces in three horizontal rows.
- Sew pieces together in rows.
- Join rows to make a block.
- The block is 12½" unfinished.

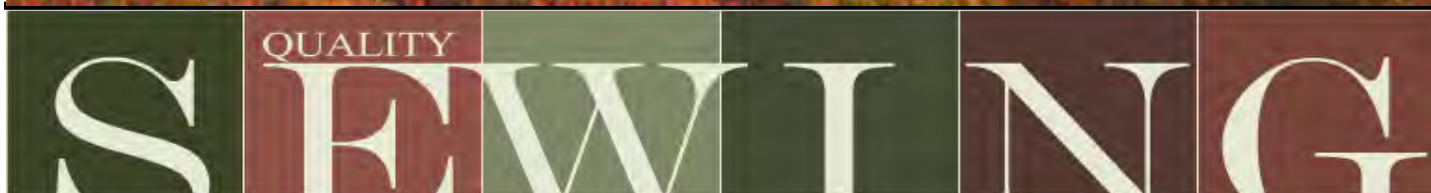
