Vicki has an extensive international fiber portfolio, with her work being featured in both public and private collections. Her work is strongly influenced by hiking and traveling and can be seen in her "National Park" series featuring her distinctive fractured landscapes.

Vicki's love for art began as a youngster. She explored papier-mâché, macramé, pastels, painting, stitchery and whatever else she could do with her hands. Art education seemed the route she would pursue until the ninth grade when an exceptional science teacher opened her eyes and heart to another direction. For the next eleven years, she followed the dream of science to a Master of Science degree in Physiology and subsequently worked in medical research. When Vicki and her husband started a family, she quit work and enrolled in a pottery class. What began as a hobby grew steadily into a full-time business. She established Pinon Pottery where she still sells her work. In 2004, she discovered quilting when a fellow artist at a craft show gave her one



of her quilting patterns. She quickly began designing her own art quilts; exploring color, form and texture utilizing a myriad of modern methods. Although she has explored many other artistic media over the years, Vicki has found her niche in designing art quilts. She strives to balance her life between the business of making pottery and the joy and need to make quilts.

She loves trying new techniques and materials, and usually explores themes in the natural world using her own photographs as inspiration and she enjoys interpreting it in both realistic and abstract forms.

### Funding Criteria

1. A current CQC member in good standing and for at least one year.
2. Scholarship amount is limited to \$75.00 per class.
3. A maximum of 6 scholarships are given each calendar year, no more than 2 per quarter for a maximum of \$500.
4. If more than 6 applications meet the requirements. A lottery will be used to select the recipients.
5. Scholarships are limited to tuition only. No registration, entrance fees, nor kit fees.
6. The class should be quilt related—description of class and purpose for taking the class must be clearly stated.
7. Requests are needed 30 days prior to the class start date to allow for approval and funding.
8. Scholarship payments are payable to the vendor for the class, not the individual. In the event a payment must be made with the application, confirmation of enrollment and payment received must accompany the application and check request form.



## 2022 Library Year-End Report

The CQC Library collection was increased by 117 items in 2022, through donations from our very generous CQC members and a few purchases. There are now 2,620 items in the CQC Library collection. Donated duplicate items were sold at Quilt-A-Fair to generate additional revenue of \$302. Library items were made available for check-out at in-person general meetings and via mail. Checked out books were returned at general meetings or via mail. Book reviews were provided for the monthly CQC Newsletters.

CQC received a large donation (>500) of books from the Parker Piece Keepers Quilt Guild in November. These books will be added to the Library's inventory or available for purchase at QAF in 2023.



# Crumb Quilts .....

## Book Review by Carol Cook

Most quilters accumulate large amounts of scraps leftover from quilt projects and are faced with the question of what to do with these scraps. Emily Bailey has written *Crumb Quilts: Scrap Quilting the Zero Waste Way* (2021, David and Charles) to show quilters how to use the tiniest scraps, or “crumbs”, to make quilt blocks, applique shapes and even background fabrics. Quilters realize that using scraps to create new quilts is an economical way to express their creativity and resourcefulness. Making crumb quilts doesn't require any special tools which is another cost-effective aspect of her method.

Using plenty of full-color pictures, Emily demonstrates how to sew many small pieces (crumbs) of fabric together to create larger, colorful fabric sections. Tips on how to deal with multiple seams and how to stabilize the fabric which may have different bias edges are included. Detailed instructions for using crumb fabrics for pieced blocks, backgrounds, fused applique and reverse applique are provided. Projects using each of these methods are included in the book. These projects range from a cushion, table toppers and runners, wallhangings, to lap and bed sized quilts.

“Under the Sea” is one of the projects included in *Crumb Quilts* and uses many of the crumb techniques. It includes 5 different fish blocks, turtle, whale and appliqued

jellyfish blocks, and crumb pieced coral on a crumb background. It is an imaginative use of scraps to create a wonderful wallhanging or lap quilt. Detailed instructions for each of the blocks and the construction of the quilt sections are provided.

Once a quilter understands the crumb quilting techniques, these can be applied to any quilt project. The possibilities are truly endless. It's time to get out those bins of lovely scraps and start using them to create your own unique quilt to showcase your style and creativity!



# Block of the Month by Sandy Wheeler

## Chained Star Block 3




Light: Cut 2 strips 2 1/2" x 12"  
Cut 1 strip 2 1/2" x 6"  
Cut 2 squares, 5 1/4"

Light Med: Cut 1 strip 2 1/2" x 12"  
Cut 1 strip 2 1/2" x 6"

Dark Med: Cut 1 strip 2 1/2" x 12"  
Cut 1 strip 2 1/2" x 6"

Dark: Cut 2 squares 5 1/4"



Side Squares: Place one dark 5 1/2" square and one light 5 1/2" square right sides together. Repeat with the other dark 5 1/2" square and the light 5 1/2" squares. Use these to make quarter square triangles. \*


Corner Squares: Sew 1 Med Dark 12" strip, long sides together, to 1 Light strip. Crosscut into 4 2 1/2" sections. Assemble into 2 four patch units.

Repeat with the other 2 1/2" Light strip and Med Light strip.

Center Square: Sew the Light Med 6" 2 1/2" strip, long sides together, with the Dark Med 6" 2 1/2" strip and crosscut into 2 2 1/2" sections. Assemble into a 4 patch.

Square up all units to 4 1/2" and assemble the block according to the shaded diagram.


\*To make quarter square triangles: On the back of the lighter of the fabrics, draw a line diagonally from corner to corner. Then another line diagonally from corner to corner making an X. These will be cutting lines. Then 1/4" on either side of one of the lines, draw 2 stitching lines. With two squares, right sides together, sew on the two outside stitching lines. Then cut into 2 halves on the line between the two stitching lines. Then divide those two parts on the other line. Press out and you will have 4, 1/4 square triangles.

# 2022 Quilt-a-Fair Year End Report by Dawn Mills

Profit \$29,000 2340 attendees + 140 volunteers & committee members



The show was a success this year, bringing in quilters from across the state, as well as the US. We had 45 vendors from across the US, including a new vendor from Hawaii. We also hosted three Raffle Quilts from local guilds and brought back the CQC Booth in full form this year. A special thank you to the committee members who worked tirelessly to make this show happen!

We Celebrated Quilting with our first Kid's Quilt Show and Activity Area. We worked with the Rocky Mountain Quilt Museum to get kids to enter the show. We had 19 quilts and everyone was thrilled to see the creativity and workmanship. We also handed out a flyer to participants with information about shops in Colorado that offer quilt classes for kids. We hope to have many more quilts next year. We also displayed five quilts from Kathy Emmel's Student Made Quilts to highlight more of what kids can do with quilting. Thank you to Penny Christensen and Scotti McCarthy for their leadership on this show.

Our member show featured a variety of quilts, 65 to be exact, which received many wonderful comments. People loved the mix of patterns instead of a one-type-of-quilt themed show. We will continue with this approach next year. Thank you to Katie Melich and Karen Brown for chairing this part of the event.

We have started the planning process for the 2023 and 2024 shows and are looking for new members for the main committee, as well as volunteers during the show. We look forward to seeing everyone at Quilt-a-Fair in September of 2023.
