In one way, Shelley Scott-Tobisch and Bernie Tobisch have a typical relationship, recognizable to every quilter and quilter's husband: she has not finished the quilt she's been making for him for more than 15 years. As Shelley puts it, "Bernie is patiently waiting for me to finish his, as he calls it, 'Alleged Quilt.'" And he may have to wait a little longer, given their active teaching schedule. CQC is thrilled that they were able to squeeze us in.

They attribute the success in their quilt work and in marriage to mutual but different interests.

Shelley loves tiny pieces, scrappy quilts and precision. Her favorite block is the Nine Patch, and her favorite unit is the half square triangle. She began quilting in the mid-80's and "it was love at first

stitch." Eager to share her passion, Shelley began teaching others to quilt.

Bernie's passion is machinery, from service to factory settings. A sewing machine tech since the 70's he estimates that by now he's serviced between 50-60,000 machines of all makes and models. His books *You and Your Sewing Machine* and *Sewing Machine Reference Tool* (C&T Publishing) have helped numerous sewists troubleshoot and build better relationships with

their machines.

Bernie and Shelley met at the quilt shop which housed his Bernina dealership and where she was teaching. As Bernie was called in to assist students with machine problems, "We soon found that the flow of the class could be maintained with both of us in the classroom." And voila! Team Tobisch was born. The couple believes that their individual goals benefit all students, with Bernie's machine expertise and Shelley's mastery of technique.

Please contact me if you are interested in any of these positions or if you have any questions.



You won't want to miss our October speakers...Team Tobisch. They will be telling us how to prepare for sewing and will present a workshop on precision piecing.





About Acorn Piecing Products:

Acorn Precision Piecing Products is the Team Tobisch branded line of glue and other "job aids" for quilters. The team emphasizes that they didn't invent these products to be sold, "but to make Shelley's piecing process easier and more accurate. When people saw what Shelley was doing and how easy the process was, they wanted some too." The idea and formula for **Seam Align Gentle Hold Fabric Glue** came about during the making of Shelley's Apple Yard Lane quilt. While she was working on a block with a precious old fabric from her stash, she made a mistake. While trying to separate the



pieces, the fabric glue she was working with held too hard and the fabric was shredded. It was unusable. Her heart broken, Shelley knew that a gentle hold of fabric glue would avoid future accidents.

Easy Press Fabric Treatment was a happy accident when Bernie was working on a formula for something else that didn't work out. A desire to accurately apply Easy Press Fabric to seams while the block was in progress led them to discover the **Easy Press Fabric Pen**.

Quilt Block Builders is the silver lining from a dark cloud. After a bad fall and a brain injury, Shelley found that she couldn't keep the pieces and units of blocks in the correct order. This inspired her to create **Quilt Block Builders**, which she calls blueprints of the blocks. Together Bernie and Shelley created the **Block Builder Base**. **Block Builder Bases** are like mini design walls. By slipping the blueprint of the block under the non-slip, see-through fabric, a quilter can keep units and blocks in order during the piecing process. If you have cats or other "helpers" in your sewing room while you piece, this may be for you.

Shelley is the author of *Easy Precision Piecing* (C&T Publishing) and has contributed to various magazines such as American Quilt Retailer and AQ Magazine. Team Tobisch has appeared on The Quilt Show twice, and will be heading to Houston after teaching for CQC. They look forward to sharing Bernie's machine expertise and showing how a little fabric glue leads to painless, error-free piecing with Shelley's Fruit Medley design.

CQC Outreach Award- A History by Jackie Anderson

The Outreach Award was established in October of 1993 at the suggestion of Auriel Sandstead (founding mother) and has continued its rich tradition to the present day. Its goal, according to Auriel in a letter to the CQC Board in June of 1995, reminded us that "Colorado history has included prospecting—a going beyond to seek, find and salute. Outreach should serve as a prospecting tool for CQC."

Her idea was different than the Hall of Fame award. She opposed "modifying or constraining in any way, the one avenue directed to examine and bring to CQC additional information about unheralded quilters and quilt heritage—the Mission of Outreach in Colorado." Thus, this award recognizes those persons or organizations that make an outstanding contribution to quilters or quilt making which can be educational, historical or creative. Membership in CQC is not a requirement and, therefore, gives the membership a much larger base from which to seek and recognize these organizations or persons.

The committee consists of a Chairperson and at least three members of CQC. Letters of recommendation are submitted by a June 1 deadline so that they may be considered and voted upon by the

Chairperson and committee in time to make the award presentation at the July birthday meeting.

It has been a wonderful job for me for the past three years during my 34 year membership, and the recipients of this award have been so richly deserving of this recognition. My committee has been outstanding and has a long and rich tradition with CQC. We are looking for committee members to spread the word how CQC honors those who work outside our council to make quilting what it has become today. Project Warm Hearts- Jeanette Jenks and Ralston House by Betsy Stewart

In August 2022, Project Warm Hearts awarded a quilt to Jeanette Jenks for the benefit of Ralston House.

Ralston House helps child victims heal from abuse. Ralston House Child Advocacy Center works with law enforcement, human services, district attorney's offices in the 1st and 17th Judicial Districts (Jefferson, Adams, Gilpin and Broomfield counties), and the community to provide a safe place to investigate child abuse and ensure victim



services for children who have been physically or sexually abused or witnessed violence. Ralston House is projected to complete over 1,000 forensic interviews and medical exams for children and teens.

Ralston House also provides education and outreach to the general public to prevent child abuse.

Raffle Quilt- Circular Fascination by Karen Hadfield and Maryann Ray

It's been a busy month! At the end of July, we showcased "Circular Fascination" at the 43rd Annual Arts Picnic in the beautiful and historic Lincoln Park in downtown Greeley. The event this year was not quite as well attended by the public as last year. However, thanks to a great group of volunteers, namely Daisy Boulter, Karen Brown, Carol Connell, Karen Downs, Pat Smith, Cindy and Mike Welsh, and Karen's husband Jerry coming to assist, we increased the tally by \$403.

Karen Hadfield shared the quilt on Aug. 4th. with the Palmer Divide Quiltmakers (PDQ) during their monthly meeting, raising an additional \$50 in ticket sales, bumping us just over \$4,000. As of this writing, we've sold just over \$4,200.

Our thanks to Marge Serck, owner of Creative Needle in Littleton, for inviting us to spend the last weekend of the Rocky Mountain Shop Hop in her store. Another \$150+ was generated for the cause... Also, to Pam Hull owner of Sew-In-Tune in Monument to be featured at the 3rd Thursday Art Hop!

This event is sponsored by the Black Forest Community Foundation and Friends of the Log School in honor of the Centennial Anniversary of the Log School. We were invited by our own CQC member Anne Jeffcoat, to display "Circular Fascination" and sell Raffle Tickets at the occasion.

It was wonderful to see so many of you at Quilt-A-Fair! Thank you for supporting CQC's 40+ year tradition of quilt shows, Vendors Market and fun!


Committee News & Needs

Quilt Trails

What is the Colorado Quilt Trail? CQC joined a national movement to promote Quilt Trails across the United States in 2011. The purpose of this movement was to promote the heritage of quilting in various communities and increase the awareness of quilting. Initially, our website only included blocks made through CQC. As of October 2021, we invite others to contact us at CQC QuiltTrails@gmail.com if they know of a trail in Colorado that they would like included on the web page.

Quilt Trails are a celebration of the designs that go into quilt blocks, but they are not made of fabric like a quilt would be. Quilt block designs are painted on wood, or another durable surface, and on display for people to see as they travel through an area, or visit shops and businesses in their own hometown. The blocks are usually 2' square or 4' square, and sometimes 8' square, and may be posted in shop windows, or attached to the sides of buildings. The trail sites in Colorado include businesses, personal homes, museums, and of course quilt shops.

In 2021, CQC embarked on an inventory of our old trails. As of October 2021, the inventory is about half done. We're pleased to report, most of the sites are still there to welcome you. Sites will move from the unconfirmed list to trail tables directly on the website as the inventory continues.

The Library is an awesome resource containing 2,515 items, mostly books, with some DVDs, related to all aspects of quilt making. Members can check items out for up to 3 months and renew them for an additional 3 months if needed. A very small selection of items is brought to the CQC monthly meetings for members to view and check out. In 2019, our library inventory was placed into an on-line tool called *Library Thing*. Members can search for specific items or by key words. A tutorial on how to use *Library Thing* is available in the December 2020 newsletter. Volunteers are needed at the Library table during monthly meetings to assist with checking materials out and accepting returns, as well as to assist members with locating the perfect resource for their quilting needs. 

Scholarships available for Workshops and Classes

Colorado Quilting Council invites members to apply for scholarships to take classes and workshops offered through the council or other quilting entities. The scholarships can be used for online workshops the same as in-person workshops.

Applicants must be CQC members in good standing for at least one year before applying. Scholarships are paid directly to the entity offering the class, not the recipients. Applications must be received by the end of each month and at least 30 days before the workshop/class date.

Scholarships pay tuition only, not registrant, entrance fees or kit fees. They are limited to \$75 per person. A maximum of six scholarships totaling up to \$500 will be awarded in a calendar year. If more than six applicants meet the requirements, recipients will be determined through a lottery. The workshop/class must be quilt-related. Applications must include a description of the workshop/class and the applicant's purpose in taking it.

Shirley Sanden was a founder of Colorado Quilting Council. The scholarships are given in her memory. CQC members support the scholarship fund through buying chances to win quilts and quilt-related items at in-person meetings of CQC. Donations to the fund can be made at any time.

Book Review



Easy Precision Piecing

Many quilters would like to improve their piecing skills whether they are new to quilting or have many years of experience. Shelly Scott-Tobisch shares the methods she's developed which result in precise piecing and impeccable blocks in *Easy Precision Piecing* (2018, C & T Publishing). Shelley claims her methods are "simple to adapt" and provides detailed information about all the steps for creating a high quality quilt.

Key to the Easy Precision Piecing approach is the use of Quilt Block Builders, a fabric placement and pressing guide which also allows the quilter to "audition" fabric for the block. Use of this tool helps the quilter achieve flat seams and precise intersections. Another tool is the Quilt Block Base which doubles as a way to store block pieces and as a mini design wall. It keeps the block pieces organized and facilitates the ease of moving quilt blocks between sewing, pressing and cutting areas.

There is a thorough discussion on choosing fabrics which will help quilters maintain balance in contrast and design. Shelley emphasizes "fabric prep is the first step in precision piecing" and covers pre-washing (including the popular




pre-cut fabric strips and squares), starching, pressing and storing fabrics.

Proper cutting techniques include the first cut, squaring up the fabric edge, holding the rotary cutter, lengthening blade life and safety. Methods for creating a precision seam include balanced tension, uniform bobbins, threading the machine properly, sewing straight seams and using glue, not pins, to align fabric pieces. Shelley encourages the use of a starch alternative to obtain the flattest seams possible.

Once the quilter understands all of the elements of the Easy Precision Piecing system, they are ready to make one of the 6 projects included in the book. A Quilt Block Builder is provided for each block used in the projects to assist the quilter in achieving precise blocks. The book concludes with instructions for adding a border, the binding and a label. Overall, this book provides very detailed and thorough instructions for all phases of quilting.


It would be a good resource for quilters of all experience levels who want to improve their quilt's precision and quality.


